

NURSING SCHOLARSHIPS AVAILABLE
to students at

Private Agencies:

1. **Memorial Hospital, South Bend:** Tuition and book assistance is available for Memorial employees through tuition reimbursement and several scholarships for those employees who apply for and meet the respective requirements. Each program has a 1 year payback work requirement. Scholarships available to Fulltime/Part-time/PRN and tuition reimbursement to full-time or part-time. Must have completed probationary period. Contact - Debbie Szuba (574) 647-7456. Clinical Associate positions are available for student nurses. Contact the Nursing Recruiter– Amanda Flick 647-7447. Students hired in May and December.
2. **Golden Living Centers:** Employed 1 year and 2 year work commitment after receiving assistance. Tuition reimbursement \$1,200 year. Contact -Human Resources Department of the facility.
Golden Living Centers Locations: Golden Living Centers – LaPorte, Elkhart, Mishawaka, & Knox; Fountainview, Mishawaka; Fountainview Terrace, LaPorte.
3. **Elkhart General Hospital:** Up to \$6,000 scholarships annually to qualified applicants for full or part-time study. Full-time Elkhart General Employees are eligible for \$1,000 for tuition per year, part-time receive \$750 annually. 4. **Bremen Hospital:** Scholarships to senior high school students at Bremen High School, to children of employees and employees. A tuition reimbursement is available for employees. Employees or nursing students may be selected for tuition support who agree to work there after they graduate. Contact – Patty Board (574) 546-2211.
5. **LaPorte Hospital:** Indiana University Health LaPorte Hospital, the LaPorte Hospital Foundation and LaPorte Hospital Auxiliary sponsor scholarships and awards/loans to provide financial assistance to students pursuing health care careers. 6. **St. Joseph Regional Medical Center, South Bend:** Provides tuition reimbursement for full-time and part-time employees in a nursing program. Additional funds are available through the Shield Foundation for BSN & ADN programs. Contact Jo Ravello at 335-2418. St. Joe hires nursing students who are at the sophomore level. 7. **IU Health Goshen Hospital:** Tuition reimbursement is available for full-time colleagues after 90 days of employment. Part-time colleagues eligible after six months of employment. Scholarships and interest-free loans for nursing students are available based primarily on financial need. Students who are approved have an obligation to apply for employment at Goshen Hospital at the completion of their program and to accept and stay for one year if a position is offered. Government Agencies:

1. **U.S. Public Health Service:** SRCOSTEP - available to full time students during their final year of academic study or professional training. The program of study must lead to the completion of the academic and professional requirements outlined on our website by [professional discipline](#). Those selected for the program can receive pay and benefits of an active duty officer at the O-1 level for up to 12 months while completing their academic or professional training. Applications are accepted from all Commissioned Corps eligible areas of study, though clinical positions (e.g. nurses, nurse practitioners, pharmacists and physician assistants) are most often selected. In return for financial assistance, SRCOSTEP participants agree to work for the sponsoring agency as a Commissioned Corps Officer after graduation. The service obligation is equal to twice the time sponsored; that is, for 9 months of financial support, a SRCOSTEP participant commits to 18 months of employment with the division or organization that provided the support. 2. **Reserve Officers Training Corp. (ROTC):** Scholarships available for two, three, or four years for undergraduate nursing students. All scholarship students will be required to serve in the military for a period of eight years. This obligation may be fulfilled by serving four years on Active Duty, followed by four years service in the Individual Ready Reserve (IRR). (www.nd.edu/-army/Scholarships.html)
3. **National Health Service Corps:** Scholarship recipients must agree to serve in an underserved community upon graduation and licensure. Call 1-800-221-9393; email callcenter@hrsa.gov.
4. **Indiana Nursing Scholarships:** \$500 to \$5,000 for ADN students. Must work in Indiana health care for two years after graduation. Applications in Financial Aid Office or call (574) 257-3316.

5. **Scholarships for Disadvantage Students (SDS):** A federal scholarship program from the Department of Health and Human Services. Students who come from educationally or financially disadvantaged environments are considered. Awards vary based on need. Please see Deb Gillum in S147 or contact 574-807-7015 for details.

Private Awards:

1. **National Daughters of the American Revolution, Schuyler Colfax Chapter:** See website at www.dar.org/natsociety/edout_scholar.cfm.
 - **Madeline Pickett (Halbert) Cogswell Nursing Scholarship:** Awarded to students who are accepted or enrolled in an accredited school of nursing. Applicants must be members, descendants of members or be eligible for membership in NSDAR. This is a one-time award of \$1,000.
 - **Caroline E. Holt Nursing Scholarship:** Awarded to students who are in financial need and are accepted and enrolled into an accredited school of nursing. This is a one-time award of \$1,000.
2. **N-OADN:** Offers scholarships for AD nursing students and to a master's degree seeking nurse who plans to teach in an associate degree nursing program. Applicants for all student scholarships must be enrolled or entering their second year in a state approved associate degree nursing program, have earned a minimum GPA of 2.5 on a 4.0 scale, and actively participate in a student nurses association. All student scholarships are for \$1000.00 each. N-OADN membership is not required. Applicants for all N-OADN Foundation scholarships for educators must be a N-OADN member at the individual or agency level.  - **Naomi Brack Scholarship Application:** This is a \$1,000 award for current ADN students. The applicants must have a minimum GPA of 3.0 and be involved in the Student Nurse Association. See website for qualification requirements: https://www.noadn.org/dmddocuments/Brack_Award_2011.pdf
3. **Indiana Health Care Foundation:** Individual scholarships will be no less than \$750. To be considered you must reside in the State of Indiana, have a GPA of 2.5 or higher on a 4.0 scale, possess a high school diploma or GED, be accepted to an LPN or RN accredited degree program, pursue a career to work with the elderly in a long-term care environment. 4. **Foundation of the National Student Nurses Association, Inc.:** This application is available at www.nsna.org. ADN, BSN or RN students are eligible. Scholarships range from \$1,000 to \$5,000.
5. **P.E.O. Educational Loan Fund:** A revolving loan fund available to women enrolled in full-time study, maximum amount of \$10,000. Contact – Becky Penn at 574-277-3529.
6. **American Association of University Women:** Scholarship for women 25 years of age or older who are enrolled in an accredited 4-year college, an accredited Junior or Community College, or an accredited post high school technical training program. 7. **National Association of Pro-Life Nurses:** \$1,000 scholarship to be paid directly to the school selected by the applicant. The scholarship may be used for tuition, books, and/or supplies. See website at www.nursesforlife.org.
8. **Indiana Association for Health Care Recruitment:** Scholarships are awarded to support health care education. Monies will be awarded directly to the school to be used toward tuition fees. This money cannot be used for books or other non-tuition related fees. All applicants must be Indiana residents, students must meet the eligibility requirements listed on the application.
